Returning to the show this year will be a Tug O War and Sheep Shearing competition.

"This year we are very excited to be using the Veolia Arena to display our Photography and Arts, we will be using the stage in the Arena for live Entertainment over the weekend and other displays," Mrs Waugh said.

"The official opening will be held at 11.30am on the Saturday by Assistant Commissioner Gary Worboys. "Other competitions to watch out for is the Wine

Show. Wood chop in front of the grand stand, Junior Showgirl & Showman Competition, come and meet our 2105 Showgirl Bonnie Skinner, view live demonstrations in the Produce Pavilion, and much, much more!



Crier Alan to read the news

OH YAY, oh yay, good people of Goulburn, make way for town crier - Alan Moyse.

Alan, was officially sworn in by Chief Minister Katy Gallagher back in 2011 in Canberra and is now an official member of the Ancient and Honourable Guild of Town Criers

According to Alan, this is the first time Canberra has had a town crier since 1925.

"It's a very ceremonial and honorary position," Alan said.

"Town criers were the old news readers, they'd go into the town square, village square, city square and they'd proclaim the news and then they'd post the news up on the cross in the town centre, or the wall or sometimes the pub or the local church.

"Which is why a lot of newspapers are called 'The Post'.'

Alan will be crying at the Goulburn Show over the two days, letting everyone know what is happening around the grounds.

Show on hold as army occupied

WITH this year's theme for the show being the "Centenary of Anzac" it is fitting to celebrate it at the 2015 Goulburn Show this year.

Looking over old records it mentions that the show was not held in the years of the 1916 and 1917 as the Army



had the use of the show ground, and when the army vacated the grounds it was necessary to put the showground back into the condition necessary to hold the 1918 show.

A Gala night was held in the main street of Goulburn on the nights of the 1918 show to raise money for the war

Ride a camel

OAKFIELD Ranch Camel Rides, another first for Goulburn, will be travelling all the way from the Central Coast.

Rodney Sansom will be bringing them down to Goulburn, so you will all be able to have a close up look of these great animals and experience the thrill of the ships of the desert with a ride around the Show grounds.

Mr Sansom, the founder of Oakfield Ranch, found his love for animals after growing up around Oakfield Ranch. He then started out organising pony rides and has since moved on to working with horses, carriages, camels and hire for any occasion such as movies, commercials, weddings, school formals anniversaries, birthdays, engagements.

From cats to cavies animals on show

ALPACAS will feature again this year on the Saturday in the Peden Pavilion at the Goulburn Show.

Then on the Sunday local breeders will be on hand displaying their alpacas and products and will be available to answer questions.

Also on the Saturday you can see all the cats being judged by three expert judges, with lots of different breeds and classes to be judged, too many to name

On Sunday the cats will be replaced with a display of rabbits and cavies, on the Sunday in the Peden Pavilion the Angora Goats will be holding their show, exhibiting animals and fleeces. They will also be holding the Schools competition and Young Judges competition.

Under the skillion section will be an array of trade stalls promoting and selling their produces, just outside in the open area will be show bags galore, many food stalls and lots more commercial dis-

Over to the Poultry Pavilion you can check out the Chooks being shown on the Saturday, there will be all varieties of poultry from hard feather, soft feather in standard and bantam and Water fowl, there is also a Junior Poultry Exhibitors section.

The Animal nursery will also have an array of animals to have a look at, I wonder what new animals they have this year? There will also be a display of Dorper and Black and Coloured Sheep.

Out to the Cattle yards

near Gate 3 you will find on Saturday the Donkey Display starting at 10am until they finish that afternoon and on the Sunday they will have their Donkey Show.

Unfortunately there is no Cattle at this year's Show as it's too close to Sydney Royal Easter Show and most breeders will be on their way

The Breed Dogs will be showing up to 500 dogs, at the dog area near Gate 5 on Bungonia Road, so go for a short walk down that way to see the amazing varieties of Breed Dogs.

Over to the Rodeo Ring on Saturday and Sunday will be the Team Sorting, which is great to sit and watch, sporting will be held on the Saturday just below the

Rodeo grounds starting at 10am and not to be forgotten in the main show ring running both Saturday and Sunday will be all the horse events, from showjumping, rider and breed classes.

And don't forget Sideshow Alley that will be well attended this year as many rides are waiting to set up for the Sydney Show.
