All work must be clean and the work of the exhibitor, and not shown at a previous Goulburn Show

A novice is someone who has been learning the craft of spinning and/or weaving over the last 12 months.

A garment is an item that can be worn – dress, jacket, scarf or hat.

An article is a utility item that is not worn – toy, picture, blanket or bag.

#### **HANK SECTION**

**701** Hank of 100% handspun wool, black or natural, 4ply thickness or less, 50 gms. Add sample

**702** Hank of 100% handspun wool, black or natural, over 4 ply thickness, 50 gms. Add sample

**Best Hank of handspun wool from naturally coloured fleeces from Classes 701 and 702 - \$15 cash prize donated by South Coast and Southern Tablelands Black & Coloured Sheep Breeders**

**703** Hank of handspun made by a novice, any fibre may be used, 50 gms. Add sample

**704** Hank of handspun yarn, wool and fibre blend. Fibre to be blended in carding not plying. Fibre to be named. Add sample

**705** Hank of handspun, fibre other than wool, 50 gms. Fibre to be named. Add sample

**706** Hank of novelty yarn, any fibre. 50 gms and a description of the yarn. Add sample. Blend can be in the plying.

**707** 4 hanks of handspun, commercially dyed yarn of 10 gms each. Neatly displayed and dyes labelled.

**708** 4 hanks of handspun, naturally dyed yarn of 10 gms each. Neatly displayed and dyes labelled.

**709** Hank of handspun tops, any fibre. 50 gms. Add sample

#### **CHAMPION HANK (Classes 701 – 709)**

**\$20 cash prize donated by Hand Weavers and Spinners Guild of NSW Inc.**

**710** Handspun, hand knitted or crocheted garment made from 100% wool. Sample to be added.

**711** Handspun, hand knitted or crocheted **garment or article** made by a novice. Any fibre, add sample.

**712** Any handspun, hand knitted or crocheted **garment** made from a **combination** of fibres. Fibres can be blended in the carding or plying process. Give samples.

**713** Any **article** or **accessory** made from any fibre or fibre blend. Fibres to be blended in the carding process. Add sample fibres used e.g. scarf, gloves, socks, beanies, rugs, toys etc.

**714** Any handspun, hand knitted, crocheted **garment or article** made from 100% **Mohair or Alpaca**. Add staple sample.

**715** **Garment or article** woven by a novice. Warp and welt fibre sample.

**716** Any **garment** made from woven material, any yarns. Add sample yarns used.

**717** Any **article** made from woven material, any yarns. Sample of yarns.

**Best hand woven garment or article – Classes 715-717**

**\$20 cash prize donated by Hand Weavers and Spinners Guild of NSW Inc.**

**718** Any **garment or article** made on an **inkle loom**.

**719** **Article or garment** made from felt.

**Best hand felted article/garment – Class 719**

**\$20 cash prize donated by Hand Weavers and Spinners Guild of NSW Inc.**

**720 Article or garment** made from felt by a novice.

**721** Any handspun, hand knitted, crocheted **garment or article hand dyed**. Any fibre, dyes to be listed.

**722** Handspun, hand knitted, or crocheted children's or babies wear made from any fibre. Sample of fibre used.

**WOOL ARTICLE/GARMENT STATE COMPETITION**

**THREE DIFFERENT TYPES OF WOOL ARTICLES and/or GARMENTS CONDITIONS:**

1. For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
  - a) **Garment:** an item that can be worn e.g. dress, jacket, scarf, hat
  - b) **Article:** a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home e.g. blanket; with an outfit eg. bag; for amusement eg. toy; as a decoration eg. picture etc.
  - c) **Three Different Types:** the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or their purpose eg.1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy OR eg.2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy OR eg.3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.
2. The **whole** article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of, **80% wool**.
3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of sewing machine is permitted)
4. **A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit.** If a label is not available as a hand spun/felted, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitors permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.
