ALL FLOWERS ARE TO BE GROWN BY EXHIBITOR

Definitions

- * "DISTINCT" means different e.g. separate varieties/cultivars
- * "NOT NECESSARILY DISTINCT" (NND) means an exhibit need not necessarily consist of different varieties/cultivars, they can all be identical or they can be more than one colour.
- * "A BUD" is considered as a flower and could cause disqualification if class asks for 1 bloom and there is a bud and a full flower.
- * NOS = NOT ON SCHEDULE
- * NAS = A judge may write NAS on an exhibit if it is Not According to Schedule.

Flower Hints

Pick most show entries on judging morning - very early (or late on the evening before) and put straight into water up to their necks - then take inside for sorting out into individual jars. Don't add anything to the water as long as the flowers have a good drink when picked most will last without additives.

The stage of bloom at cutting time is critical. The flowers should be fully out at judging but JUST!
Judges look for different things with flowers and it is not always size. Symmetry is very important - an even shape on both sides) and blemish free blooms.

Floral Art Hints

Floral art sections are in titles - they are an art form, and the title suggests the style and the finished article is a whole picture, a blend of shape, size, colour of container and contents. The first element is the container and it must suit the style. "Bold & Beautiful" for example would not suggest a shapely slender container.

The next important element is the line material, or non-plant material that provides the background, the emphasis being on 'line' A 'no-no' is for any supportive structure/s to be visible. Arrange foliage to hid them.

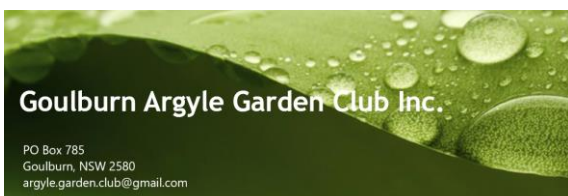
