Prize money: No cash prizes unless otherwise stated

Junior Section: Prizes will be ribbons unless otherwise stated

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- * All work MUST be COMPLETED, clean, not worn or used and the sole work of the exhibitor
- * No exhibit to be entered in more than one category and must have been completed in the last 2 years and not been exhibited at a previous Goulburn Show
- * A limit of 4 items in each category per exhibitor
- * Categories may be split at the judge's discretion
- * Knitting & Crochet items blocking preferred
- * Shank buttons, beads and twisted cords are not permitted on baby's wear
- * The finish of items is included in the judging criteria, e.g. loose ends are to be woven in, seams neatly finished, etc
- * All entries falling outside judging requirements will be displayed, but will not be judged

HAND KNITTING

Class 5001 Baby's Shawl or Blanket. Any ply

Class 5002 Knitted Garment for a Baby - Any ply

Class 5003 Basic garment for a child or adult by a beginner. Any ply
Beginner being someone with 2 years or less experience. Any ply

Class 5004 Child's Garment. Jumper, Cardigan, Jacket, Dress etc. Any technique, plain, textured, patterned or combination of techniques. Any ply

Class 5005 Child's Vest. Sleeveless Garment or Sleeveless Cardigan. Any technique. Any ply

Class 5006 Adult Textured Garment. Can include Aran, Gansey, Entrelac techniques Any ply

Class 5007 Adult Stranded Garment. Any ply

All over pattern in two or more colours or partial patterning, e.g. yokes, cuffs, in two or more colours. Worked with yarns stranded plus occasional weaving in of long floats. Designs can be geometric or styled natural forms, e.g. flowers, animals

Class 5008 Adult Sleeveless Garment. Any ply

Can include vest or sleeveless cardigan with or without buttons

Class 5009 Shawl or Wrap for an Adult. Basic technique. Any ply

Class 5010 Scarf or Cowl for an Adult. Basic technique. Any ply

Class 5011 All over lace. Scarf, Shawl or Wrap. 3ply or finer

- Class 5012** Shawl or Wrap for an Adult. incorporating some advanced techniques, e.g. cable, lace, fair isle, brioche, etc. Any ply
- Class 5013** Scarf or Cowl for an Adult incorporating some advanced techniques, e.g. cable, lace, fair isle, brioche, etc. Any ply
- Class 5014** Knitted Accessories for an Adult. Can include mittens, gloves, beanies, bags or socks. Any ply
- Class 5015** Blanket or Rug not exceeding 180 x 180 cm excluding fringe. Can include crochet for joining of pieces. Any ply
- Class 5016** Any other Item of Knitting not mentioned above. Can include home furnishings, e.g. cushion covers, table runner etc. Any ply
- Class 5017** Creative Knitting. Any technique including sculptural or three-dimensional work incorporating both Knitting and Crochet (to be judged with Class 5036). Any ply
- Class 5018** Knitted Item by an Exhibitor with a Disability or Aged Care. Any ply

- *** If group support is sufficient the RAS will be invited to conduct a State Final

Class 5091 QUILTED PATCHWORK COMPETITION

1. The exhibit needs to fit within a square (1m x 1m) maximum size.
2. Framed and board mounted exhibits not permitted.
3. Must be machine pieced and machine quilted.
4. Minimal Embellishments. Small amount only not to overpower patchwork.
5. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
6. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final.
7. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
8. If, for any reason, a winner is unable to compete at Group level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
9. All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show.
10. An exhibit that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
11. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select a suitable quilt and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
12. Group Final location and date is to be determined by the Group. It is the responsibility of either the exhibitor or the Show Society to ensure the quilt is delivered on Judging Day and collected in an appropriate time frame after the competition.
